Seems to me that we often take a similar approach to the gifts we receive from God . . . Why am I getting "this"? What does God expect me to do with it? Are we ever guilty of being ungrateful for the gifts God gives to us?

- God gives us the gift of forgiveness. Do we use it if we hold grudges or in some cases "hate our brother"?
- God gives us the gift of patience. Is our response intolerance and criticism?
- God gives us the gift of peace. Do we leave it wrapped and unopened because we are having too much fun sowing seeds of discord and spending our time tearing down instead of building up?
- God gives us the gift of His Word. Do we choose to use only the parts of it that help further an agenda or that we personally agree with?
- God wants to give us the gift of sight so we can seek and find wisdom and understanding. Instead, do we choose to remain blinded by the beam in our own eye while pointing out the speck in someone else's eye?

God gives us one more gift, if we will choose to accept it . . . His Son Jesus Christ. (John 3:16-21) With that gift, we have been given a pattern for living unselfishly, an example for loving unconditionally, and the path to joy unendingly. What is our daily response to that gift? Do we shove it in the drawer of "indifference" or do we consider it for a while only to leave it collecting dust in the corner of "inconvenience"? God wants us to see the gift of Jesus Christ as priceless and allow Him to live in us, work in us, clothe us, and save us.
