LOVE FOR ALL

No offense to anyone with a birthday or anniversary in February; however, February's "claim to fame" is basically Valentine's Day. Stores and TV commercials promote it. A lot of people will buy greeting cards, chocolates, flowers, and/or jewelry in an effort to tell or remind that special someone that he or she is special to you or that you love them.

The great thing about being a Christian, is that love isn't limited to a day or a month. In fact, it really has no limits. God wants us to simply love others all the time. The really unique thing about that is we don't even really need to know a person to show our love to them.

Case in point . . . In Luke 10 we read about an encounter that Jesus had with "an expert in the law". The man was trying to test Jesus by asking him, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus turned that back on the man by asking, "What is written in the Law? How do you read it?" The expert answered correctly since he was an expert in the law, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and Love your neighbor as yourself."

Jesus acknowledged that the man had answered correctly but the man wasn't quite finished with Jesus and asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"

Jesus response in Luke 10:30-37 gave us what is referred to as "The Parable of the Good Samaritan." The way I read and understand Jesus explanation contained in His parable in response to the question, "Who is my neighbor?" is that everyone is our neighbor, even if you do not know them.

No indication is given in Luke's writing that the Samaritan knew the man he found beaten and laying on the side of the road but that didn't matter. The Samaritan showed love to the injured man by taking pity on him, bandaging his wounds, taking him to an inn, caring for him, and then giving the innkeeper money to continue to care for the wounded man. In concluding his answer to the expert in the law, Jesus asked him which of the three men who had an opportunity to help the wounded man was a neighbor to him. The man replied, "The one who had mercy on him." To that, Jesus removed all doubt as to questions about loving our neighbor and just who our neighbor is when he told him, "Go and do likewise."

The easy thing in our society is to pick and choose who we love; to buy a card or some flowers in February and that covers us for the entire year. Don't get me wrong, loving everyone is not always easy because frankly some people can be a bit unlovable at times, we can be a bit unlovable at times. Yet isn't it awesome that we have the opportunity to show love to every person we meet all year long and that we even get to decide what that love looks like? We don't have to be limited to a day in the shortest month of the year . . . we have lots of days to demonstrate our love and lots of people to love.

John gave the instruction in I John 3:18 not to love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth. No mention of a specific day, week or month. You can still buy a card or a give a gift on February 14th, but that still leaves us with over 300 days this year to be loving to everyone and to be grateful that God loves us unconditionally.
