- You strike up a conversation with your neighbor and he asks you where you attend church services.
- A church family member is alone and seems a bit depressed.
- An unexpected phone call comes and the person who called is crying.
- Someone you are acquainted with just lost a family member to COVID.

We could easily overlook or ignore any of those burning bush moments, or any others that might come our way . . . some obscure, some glaring. Better yet, we could be listening for God's voice to speak to us through such moments and be willing to respond. While we have no way of knowing how 2021 will unfold, we can count on God sending opportunities our way to serve Him while serving others.
