In the near future, the plan is to send a letter to all members with details regarding who is being placed before the congregation to be considered as elders; as well as the process we will utilize in giving our members an opportunity to evaluate those men in relation to Biblical leadership and service.

Along those lines, let me be lovingly blunt . . . we as a church, not just North Park, but universally, have at times become cannibalistic when it comes to selecting elders . . . our actions result in us "devouring" our own by placing unreal expectations on those willing to serve and knit-picking to the point that no one wants to serve. That is unfortunate and hinders the effectiveness of the Lord's church. Now, let me be clear, I am not suggesting we just accept anyone and everyone who raises a hand. We need to examine each person's body of work—how they live, what they say, if they are sincere in their desire, and how closely they possess the qualities found in I Timothy 3:1-7, Titus 1:6-9, and I Peter 5:1-4. Again, be prayerful.

I want to also encourage each of us to be committed to serving as "good sheep" once we do have an eldership in place. Our support, our respect, our cooperation, our love, and our presence in regards to our relationship with those who will be serving as our shepherds can be a significant blessing to them; can help to make their responsibility a little less challenging; and can enable them to focus their efforts on providing spiritual guidance in order to strengthen the Lord's church.

Finally, I want to encourage each of us to grow in love, compassion, understanding, forgiveness, and in building one another up. Even when we start meeting together, there will still be a significant number of our church family who will not be in attendance. Let's be our brother's keeper and continue to reach out to one another to make sure members of our church are safe, healthy, not forgotten, and made to feel valued as a result of our concern and efforts to reach out to them. We all have phones, most have emails, some know how to text, and the US Mail will deliver our letter if we put a stamp on it. Along those same lines, let's look for opportunities to do good to all people. So many are hurting right now in a variety of ways, so let's look for opportunities to serve as Jesus's ambassadors by doing good. Let others experience the love and compassion of Jesus through our efforts.

GUIDELINES FOR SERVICE ON SUNDAY, JULY 5TH:

1. We will be meeting in a designated area outside at 9:30 a.m., weather permitting, and there may or may not be shade. Wear appropriate clothing.

2. Before coming, ask yourself these questions: Are you feeling ill? Do you have a fever of 100.4 or greater? Do you have a cough, which is new? Are you having shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, which is new? Have you traveled internationally in the last month? Have you been in contact with a suspected or lab-confirmed coronavirus patient? If you answer positively to ANY of them, stay home.

3. There will be no Bible Classes or Nursery

4. We will practice social distancing with no hugs or handshakes, but will pray, sing, take communion and hear from God's word together

5. Communion serving will be modified to eliminate multiple handling

6. You must wear your mask from your car until in your seat <u>and</u> during singing.

7. You must bring your own lawn/camp chair and be directed where to sit safely apart from others who do not live in your household (at this time, even if you have a group of people who you have "let into your circle" over the past few months, we must ask that everyone who doesn't live in the same house together sit separately)

8. The building will not be open so there will be no restroom access (but the service will be kept to 45 minutes)

9. There will be designated boxes for you to deposit your contribution

10. Volunteer guides will be assisting you with where to park, set up your seat and with sanitation practices and you are expected to do what they ask

*** Brothers and Sisters – You probably had the same reaction we did as we discussed all of the precautions needed for us to come together, but <u>adhering to all of these steps are necessary to have a safe and</u> <u>meaningful worship experience</u>. Thanks for your patience, your understanding, and your love. We want to begin meeting again and this is necessary for our present circumstances. <u>Remember, this is the beginning of a transition and that flexibility will be important</u>. We expect that not everything will flow perfectly this first time back together and please be prepared for things to change from week to week as we continue to work to make our time together as uplifting and safe as possible. We have many of our number who also want to come back but cannot at this time due to risk factors. If that is you, we want you to know, that is okay! For those who are unable to gather together, we will continue to provide Online Worship through the YouTube lesson by Tim Firm. To the rest of us, please remember them and be attentive to their needs during the coming weeks.

*** In the case of inclement/possibly inclement weather, a decision will be made by 8 am whether or not we will have service. For those of you with email, please check your email in the morning to make sure service has not been cancelled. For those who do not have email, you will receive a phone call.


