FACES

"Faces in the Crowd" has long been a section found in Sports Illustrated magazine. In this small but interesting section of each edition, people from all walks of life and all parts of the country are highlighted for some significant athletic accomplishment. It could be the sixtyyear old cab driver who set the world record for most sit-ups in 5 minutes or the 10 year old girl who had three hole-in-ones at a national youth golf tournament. The idea of recognizing a few people each month from all the millions of people seems to underscore the intent of "faces in the crowd".

I appreciate how good Jesus was when it came to recognizing "faces in the crowd" during His ministry and how He set a great example for His disciples and for us today. From little children to lepers to fishermen to a woman at a well to a couple of guys walking down a road to His own mother, Jesus demonstrated the importance of acknowledging people and touching their lives at just the right time and in just the right way.

It can be easy for us to get so singularly focused on "the mission at hand" that we don't notice anyone or anything. We go from Point A to Point B and sometimes don't even remember how we got there. In my first job after college, I got a bit troubled when I would speak to the "big boss" walking down the hallway, only to have him walk right passed me and say nothing. You've got to admit when that happens consistently, it can have an impact on your self-esteem. Finally, one day I went into his office and got up the courage to ask him about it. His response was that it was nothing personal toward me but that he is always focusing on what is next on his daily schedule and often doesn't take the time to see or hear what is going on around him. That combined with the fact he was six feet, six inches tall and I was 5 feet, 10 inches tall seemed somewhat logical in regards to him not seeing me or speaking to me when we passed in a hallway.

Thankfully, Jesus wasn't that way and He doesn't want us to be that way either. Admittedly, right now when I go into a store, I am focused on getting in, getting what I need, and getting out (plus everyone is wearing a mask so not the most conducive environment for striking up a conversation with someone). However, if under normal circumstances, we don't make the effort to see the faces in the crowd then how will we ever have a favorable impact on any one? How will we ever share a smile or a kind word or a word of comfort or a gesture of thanks or even remotely resemble Jesus in our actions if we don't embrace our opportunities to demonstrate our care and concern for others, for one another? Also, people are good at wearing a mask even when they aren't wearing a mask. Follow me? On the surface, people may smile or wave or seem okay when really deep inside they are hurting or desperately longing for someone to see them, to make an effort to get to know them. We can be that "someone" simply by acknowledging their faces in the crowd, taking the time, and making the effort to see those around us, those God may have put in our path.

Matthew 9:35-38 has become one of my favorite passages. Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When He saw the crowds, He had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then He said to His disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field.'

I think you and I may just be some of the workers that the "Lord of the harvest" may be counting on to see the faces in the crowds and have compassion on them.

They were delayed a few days so that we could share with you the most recent and relevant news and information possible.

Tim's messages continue to be available each week on the church website and North Park's Facebook page. The website is located at www.northparkchurchofchristil.com. Since it is possible to meet in groups of 10 or less, perhaps you might consider including family members or close friends when you watch Tim's message as well as other services you may be viewing on line (using wise distancing and sanitizing practices, of course). Tim also sends out a mid-week devotional message each week by email. If you have an email address but are not receiving emails from North Park, please call the church office or Tim to make sure we get your email updated.

The Helping Hands Pantry is open on regularly scheduled days by using a "drive up" approach to receiving items. Also, if you are unable or fearful of going to the grocery store and need some food, please call the church office (815-633-4253).

Thank you for making regular contributions to North Park so that our ongoing financial obligations can be met. If you are able to give, you can do so by mailing your contribution to the church address. Even during these challenging times, God is at work and your generous giving is enabling several ministries of North Park to serve as a blessing to others.

Your spiritual, mental, physical, and emotional well-being is important to each of us. If there is any help we can provide to you, please do not hesitate to contact any one of us or the church office. We love all of you and miss you. We encourage you to remain strongly connected to God and to find ways to encourage each other with cards, emails, texts, phone calls, posted messages on social media sites, or even a "driveway chat". We are once again planning two remote fellowship opportunities by way of ZOOM meetings in June. On Thursday, June 11th and Sunday, June 28th (both at 6 p.m.) we will have an opportunity to log in via the internet and enjoy seeing some faces and hearing some voices from North Park.
