

IMPACTFUL

Many of us have physical scars that serve as reminders of accidents, injuries, bad choices, or unavoidable mishaps in our lives. I have a scar on the inside of my left arm from being burned by hot antifreeze that shot out of the radiator when the cap came off in July 1990; a five inch scar above my right knee from surgery to repair a torn patella tendon in 2007; and a scar on my right arm from the repair of a torn bicep in 2012. I can remember how they happened, when they happened, and the aftermath of each.

We may also have emotional or spiritual scars from past hurts or errors that remind us of people and things that we are embarrassed to share with others or even stop to consider ourselves because they are too painful. It is said that "time heals all wounds" but it rarely erases the scars/the memories. At best, we learn from them, move on, try to do better, and look for ways to make up for them in some manner.

However, I don't want to focus on the negative in this March 2022 *Encourager* article. After all, March is a great month . . . I was born in March and will actually turn 65 this month (I know you are surprised that I am really that old).

Lately, I've been thinking about people who have left their mark on my life in favorable ways. It seems relatively easy to remember the scars and wounds we've endured or inflicted but maybe not so easy to remember those who have positively contributed to our lives. Recently, I shared with our Life Group the impact that my ninth grade basketball coach had on me and how what he did for me is still something I rely on to this day (some 50 years later).

"Coach M" (his last name is really too long and difficult to spell and pronounce) not only coached basketball but was my health teacher in ninth grade as well. One of the things that he taught me and every other boy in my ninth grade class was the proper way to tie a tie. You may be wondering how that's related to health class and I'm not sure it really is; but back then, if you played sports then on game day, you wore a shirt and tie to school and to the game (not to mention ties were a regular part of the wardrobe on Sundays too). He felt it important that young guys knew how to tie a tie. So for the last 50 years, every time I tie a tie, I think of Coach M. In fact, a few weeks ago I called him and we talked for twenty minutes (We'd written to each other a few times over the years but I hadn't talked with him for close to 50 years). During our conversation, I thanked him for a number of things, including teaching me to tie a tie and made sure he knew that every time I have tied a tie in the last 50 years, I thought of him.

Why is that important? Three reasons come to mind:

"9 Two people are better off than one, for they can help each other succeed. 10 If one person falls, the other can reach out and help. But someone who falls alone is in real trouble. 11 Likewise, two people lying close together can keep each other warm. But how can one be warm alone? 12 A person standing alone can be attacked and defeated, but two can stand back-to-back and conquer. Three are even better, for a triple-braided cord is not easily broken."

1) You never know how what you do for someone will impact them. 2) Just because you were never told so (or it took 50 years to find out) doesn't mean you didn't have an impact. 3) We need to do a better job of telling the people in our lives just how much we appreciate them and what they do.

The Apostle Paul wrote to the church in Philippi and thanked God for them and for the support they had given to Paul. He thanked them as well for their gifts and their partnership in the gospel. That "thanking thing" seems like a good practice and one that helps to encourage and build up those around us.

Coach M didn't teach us to tie a tie in order to get some special recognition, but because he genuinely cared about making sure we were properly equipped to carry out a task that was important to him and useful to us.

Let's keep looking for opportunities to have a positive impact on others and remember to thank those who bless our lives as well. (Just don't wait 50 years to do so.)
