Recently, I ran into a North Park member at COSTCO (free advertising for COSTCO) who was thinking that perhaps this period of ongoing isolation and continued restrictions may serve as a much needed "re-set" for people when it comes to our approach to God, our relationships with one another, and the condition of our hearts.

Do we miss seeing our church family members to the point of being compelled NOW to find ways to reach out on a daily basis to those we are missing—phone calls, drive by visits, texts, emails, cards, letters, in home worship?

Do we miss being able to worship together to the point of feeling such a strong desire in our hearts to worship God in any manner possible even if it would mean attending a worship service at North Park limited to a max of 25 attendees? While the entire congregation won't be there at once, God will be. I truly believe that.

Do we miss the full fellowship of the saints to the point of longing for the opportunities to have people into our homes, to engage with them beyond just once a week, to embrace and support them?

Once restrictions are lifted and isolation is no longer a mandate, what will we do?

Clearly, we can't go back in time and right now "our present" may limit what we are able to do; but let's not let our future, as it unfolds, be apathetic, complacent, indecisive, and stagnant in our level of service. Let's use this time of the pandemic as the "re-set button" for our lives spiritually, so our commitment to the Lord and to one another is stronger than it ever has been. To God be the glory!
