Life is full of decisions and it seems those decisions continue to plague us and become more difficult with each passing day: elections, medical procedures, family situations, financial obligations, and so on. Oh, if our decisions only consisted of whether to have a grape or cherry snow cone at the carnival (both favorites); or whether to ride the Merry-Go-Round or the Bumper Cars first. (Those were the days.)

Luke writes about the decision that Lydia and her household made to be baptized into Jesus Christ (Acts 16:11-15). Many who will read this have already made that decision; but some have not, in spite of years of prayers on their behalf and the likelihood that they know what they need to do/should do, but have chosen not to do.

Choosing to put Jesus on in baptism and become a follower of His is a decision with an "eternal" impact. No one can make that decision for you. So if you are reading this and have yet to make that decision then you have made another decision in its place . . . to miss out on heaven.

Additionally, James gets really blunt about another related decision in James 4:4, "Don't you know that friendship with the world means enmity with God? Therefore anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God." (Another important decision: friend of the world = enemy of God!)

Besides deciding which bills to pay this week or month, deciding what to have for dinner, or choosing which shoes to wear with blue jeans, there are some other choices/decisions I want to encourage us to consider <u>each day</u> as we live our lives and interact with others.

Choose LOVE over hatred and bitterness. I will love God and all that God loves.

Choose JOY over despair and look at obstacles as opportunities to experience God at work.

Choose PEACE over conflict and let God's presence replace my anxiety.

Choose PATIENCE over inconvenience and allow thankfulness to consume my complaining.

Choose KINDNESS over selfishness in order to share my blessings with others.

Choose GOODNESS over worldliness and be an example of all that is right.

Choose FAITHFULNESS over doubt so that people will come to know who I serve.

Choose GENTLENESS over cruelty and only raise my voice in praise, only clench my fists when in prayer, and only make demands of myself.

Choose SELF-CONTROL over self-indulgence and let Jesus Christ rule my life and guide my decisions.

Decide that love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control will grow in us and be evident to others in the words we speak, the actions we take, and the lives we live; because we have chosen to no longer live for self but to live for Christ. (Galatians 5:22-24)
