## PLANS

Nearly a year ago I "retired" from working full time at Field Fastener. As that retirement date was approaching, I can still remember repeatedly praying for God to watch over me and Cathy and asked that He make it clear what I am supposed to do after retiring. All I knew at the time was my last day at Field would be Monday, September 30, 2019 and the next morning I would drive to Texas to spend a month with Sara and Kailey.

Looking back, it is humbling to see what God actually had planned for me. When Jared informed the leadership team that he and Danielle were planning to move back to Texas, God had already put it on my heart to want to serve as North Park's minister once again. It started out as a matter of logic more than anything and that is how I presented it to the leadership team: it's winter and finding someone who will want to move to northern Illinois in the dead of winter will be very difficult; our attendance is down so who would consider taking a preaching job at a congregation with a shrinking membership; with smaller numbers, our giving is down so could we even afford a full-time minister; and if all that wasn't enough to discourage someone from considering the minister role at North Park, we were without an eldership which is also not something that would likely draw someone here. While those reasons made sense; in addition, I really <u>wanted</u> to serve as the minister here once again and I believe God made it possible for that to happen.

With the exception of a two year trip to Arkansas from 2004-2006, North Park has been our "home" since April 1990 when we moved here from Ohio. Sara was 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> when we moved here; she will turn thirty-five this month. Kailey was born here and is now twenty-seven. You, the North Park church, helped us teach and raise our daughters. So being able to give back to North Park in some way once again is more than logical, it is the right thing to do. I have no idea how long God will allow me to serve as North Park's minister but I am grateful for the opportunity and will continue to do my best in His service and yours.

We got off to a good start in late December, January and February; reconnecting with some people who had stopped attending, rebuilding relationships, and encouraging us to get back to basics . . . love God, love others. There seemed to be an increasing level of energy; but then came the pandemic, and what were real signs of enthusiasm and promise soon became the reality of isolation, fear, and loneliness. Just about the time we were beginning to focus once again on the joy of being with one another, we became confined to our homes. For our own safety and health--no more hugs and handshakes, no more visiting after worship services for 20-30 minutes, no more getting to host Life Groups. It didn't mean we stopped loving each other, it just meant we couldn't show it as easily as we had been doing. Still, staying connected with one another in a variety of safe methods has become even more important these days.

However, even while our world, our country, our towns, and our families remained in lockdown for several months, God put it on the hearts of a small group of men to not only consider the role of elders, but to desire it, and to risk meeting together every week to study, discuss, and grow with one another. While North Park could no longer meet as church, these men met faithfully week after week to dig deep into what God expects and needs from those who would lead His children. Through all the social distancing, the isolation, the mask wearing, and the safety of remaining dormant, God blessed these men and the efforts taking place--much to the dismay of Satan who would like nothing more than for the North Park church to go another seven years without an eldership.

I am proud of the willingness, the humility, the transparency, and the commitment of these four men to accept the responsibility of serving as elders. It was an honor for me to study with them and to have a role in appointing them to be elders. Now what I ask of each of you is to give them the opportunity to serve as North Park's eldership. Be supportive, be respectful, and willingly be involved in helping them rebuild North Park. They are humbled and honored to serve us and God in this way. Let's be just as humble and honorable in allowing God to work in them and through them so that the church that Jesus gave His life for can become an oasis for the hurting, a beacon for the wandering, and a home for more and more who desire to be faithful followers of Jesus.

#### OUTDOOR WORSHIP

At this time, we are planning to continue to meet outdoors through the month of September. We have been blessed with two months of pleasant Sunday mornings and we're hoping that continues through to October. The team who was assembled to come up with protocols for our times of worship will be communicating the plans for indoor worship in the coming weeks, with a <u>tentative plan</u> for our first indoor worship times happening on Sunday, October 4th. We ask that you continue the flexibility and patience you have exhibited thus far, as meeting inside comes with its own challenges and heightened risk factors.

#### Guidelines for outdoor worship:

1. We will be meeting in the yard behind the Essentials house at 9:30 a.m., weather permitting.

2. Before coming, ask yourself these questions: Are you feeling ill? Do you have a fever of 100.4 or greater? Do you have a cough, which is new? Are you having shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, which is new? Have you traveled internationally in the last month? Have you been in contact with a suspected or lab-confirmed coronavirus patient? If you answer positively to ANY of them, stay home.

3. There will be no Bible Classes or Nursery

4. We will practice social distancing (6 feet!) with NO HUGS or handshakes, but will pray, sing, take communion and hear from God's word together. This is very important to protect each other.

5. Communion serving will be modified to eliminate multiple handling

6. You must wear your mask from your car until in your seat and during singing.

7. You must bring your own lawn/camp chair and be directed where to sit safely apart from others who do not live in your household (at this time, even if you have a group of people who you have "let into your circle" over the past few months, we must ask that everyone who doesn't live in the same house together sit separately)

8. The building will not be open so there will be no restroom access (but the service will be kept to 45 minutes)

9. There will be designated boxes for you to deposit your contribution

10. Volunteer guides will be assisting you with where to park, set up your seat and with sanitation practices and you are expected to do what they ask

#### **UPDATED NEEDS/Reminders:**

-Couples/groups have been inching seating closer than the 6ft. We have to maintain the 6ft, please to keep each other safe when masks are off. We can do this! Thanks!!

-As announced, please always RSVP as we need this for service planning AND will need to be 100% responding when we start to move inside.

\*\*\* In the case of inclement/possibly inclement weather, a decision will be made by 8 am whether or not we will have service. For those of you with email, please check your email in the morning to make sure service has not been cancelled. For those who do not have email, you will receive a phone call.
